Who we are!

The Ministry of Justice recognises that people often seek the help of the Family Court when they are at their most vulnerable. We know family law can be hard to understand, timeframes can be frustrating, and people can feel worried and unsupported. Sometimes there are also financial, well-being, social or cultural barriers that prevent people from being able to fully engage in Family Court proceedings.

The Family Court Kaiārahi role was established to help people navigate the Family Court by providing whānau/families with information, guidance and support on their Family Court journeys. Kaiārahi also have a role in connecting the court and its users with appropriate supports available in the community.

The Kaiārahi – Family Court Navigators will aim to improve family justice outcomes for parents, whānau and tamariki by empowering families to make informed decisions on appropriate justice pathways and how to access them. They'll also provide information about how to engage with the court for legal matters or how to access out-of-court services.

This service is voluntary and acts as a bridge between community and the Ministry of Justice.
